The Manatee County 4-H Youth Program is administered in cooperation with the United States Department of Agriculture, the Cooperative Extension Service, the University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (IFAS), Florida A & M University, and the Manatee County Board of County Commissioners.

The purpose of the 4-H program is to help youth become productive members of society. By acquiring life skills, youth learn about practical problems they will face in life. Citizenship, community service, leadership, public speaking, agriculture, environmental education, and foods and nutrition are just a few of the subject-matter curricula youth learn in 4-H. In the broadest sense, 4-H is a human development program designed to foster a sense of confidence, a feeling of accomplishment, and a heightened level of competence.

During 2015, the Manatee County 4-H Program reached some, 10,540 youth between the ages of 5-18 through organized clubs, school enrichment, special interest programs, day camps, residential camps, and individual study. Our club and individual study program currently consists of 24 clubs, 139 adult volunteers and some 515 youth members.

Charitable contributions to 4-H are accepted through the Manatee County 4-H Association, Inc. /Manatee County 4-H Foundation. Through financial support received from the Foundation, we are able to maintain the quality of existing 4-H programs and initiate new program opportunities for youth to develop life skills and enhance youth/adult partnerships in our community.
